

INFECTIOUS CANINE TRACHEAL BRONCHITIS "KENNEL COUGH": Is a bacterial infection of the upper respiratory system in dogs that causes tracheobronchitis, also known as "Kennel Cough". It is characterized by harsh, hacking cough and sometimes gagging. "Kennel Cough" is analogous to a chest cold for humans. Treatment consists of antibiotics and cough suppressants. Because this is a very contagious, airborne illness, it is generally more common among dogs that have had contact with other dogs in boarding facilities and other places where multiple dogs congregate.

Destination Pet, LLC DBA Dugan's Dog House requires all of its canine friends to be vaccinated with the Bordetella vaccine every six months or every year (depending on your vet). As with any bacterial infection or virus, it is possible to transmit the virus even if your dog has received the vaccine. Vaccinating your pet every six months will help decrease the likelihood of the "Kennel Cough" infection spreading, although it is not guarantee.

STEPS WE TAKE TO HELP PREVENT THE SPREAD OF INFECTIONS, BACTERIA AND VIRUSES:

1. Updated vaccinations are required for every animal.
2. Use of pet friendly cleaners that kill almost any contagious surface organisms.
3. Replacement of clean bowls for every new animal (food bowls are replaced each feeding)
4. Dogs with possible infections are isolated from other dogs and brought to our veterinary clinic for evaluations.

However, we cannot guarantee that your Pet's vaccine will prevent them from developing "kennel cough".
